



1 First, stick the pages onto some card. Then carefully cut around the edges.





2 Now put the arms and legs onto Tigger by pushing a butterfly clip through each hole. Remember that his tail is joined to the same hole as his left leg.








# Home, sweet home

#### You will need:


Round-ended scissors Paste

#### Here's what you do:


- **1.** Cut out the three tree shapes. Then, fold each one in half, inwards, along the dotted line.
- 2. Take the tree marked (C)/(A). Then, fold along the dotted lines and paste flap (1) on to the back of tree.
- 3. Now, take the tree marked (B)/(C), and the tree marked (C)/(A). Paste the sides marked (C)/(C) back-to-back.
- 4. Take the tree marked
  (A)/(B), and the two sides
  you have just pasted
  together. Paste sides (A)/(A)
  and (B)/(B) together.
- Cut out parts (D) and (E). Match up the numbers to those on the tree trunk, fold where shown and paste them on.
- **b.** Cut out part **(F)** this is Piglet's 'bedroom' - fold the flaps **up** along the dotted lines, match up the numbers and paste on to the trunk.

Now you have Piglet's house!





Print two copies - cut the squares apart - turn them over and try to find matching pieces.




Paste the pictures a) and b)







