



COGER'S SURPRISE







Tigger wants to make a super windmill for Pooh's birthday present. He's going to show you how to make one, too.



Ask a grown-up to help you cut out the coloured square on this page. Then carefully cut along the dotted lines - but don't cut right to the middle! Fold over each numbered corner into the middle and pin them down with a paper fastener. Then use the paper fastener to attach the windmill to a thin stick. Blow your windmill and see how fast it can spin around!



Tigger is here to show you how to grow some super sunflowers from the free seeds given with this issue. You must sow the seeds before the end of May and you'll need a grown-up to help you.



1) Sow the seeds in a sunny part of the garden, at least 30cm apart and about 2 to 3cm deep.



2) Keep the soil well watered, but don't flood the seeds with too much water.



3) As the sunflowers grow, tie them to sticks to support them.



4) Flowers should appear in July. See how tall they grow!



Tigger's here to show you how to make your very own musical instrument - a super shaker. All you need is an empty yoghurt pot, a small piece of paper, an elastic band and some pasta shapes or dried peas.



1) Put the pasta in the yoghurt pot, like Tigger is doing here.



Place the paper over the top of the pot.



3) Put the band over the paper to hold it in place.



4) Trim around the edge if it's a bit too long. Now shake your shaker!



Tigger's here to show you how to make some yummy ice pops. All you need is your favourite fruit juice, some empty yoghurt pots and lollipop sticks.




1) Pour the fruit juice into the yoghurt pots.



2) Put them in the freezer for an hour or so, until they start to freeze.








4) When they're frozen, tip the ice pops out and they're ready to eat. Yummy!







Tigger's here to show you how to make a super paper aeroplane. All you need is a piece of paper 21cm by 30cm and a grown-up to help.



Fold the piece of paper in half lengthways.



Fold the top two corners down into the middle.



Fold the paper down the middle and press along the crease.



 Fold each side of the paper to make the wings.




Tigger's snowflake

Tigger wants to show you how to make your very own snowflakes! All you need is a circle of white paper, a pencil, some round-ended scissors and a grown-up to help you.



1. Draw around a cup on to a piece of paper and cut it out.




2. Carefully, fold the circle into four triangles like Tigger has done here.



Cut notches into the triangles with the scissors.




 Unfold the snowflake and hang it up or stick it to a window.






Tigger's here to show you how to make a super fir cone owl. All you need are a fir cone, paper, round-ended scissors, glue and felt pens.



1) Draw the owl's eyes and beak on a piece of paper.



2) Now draw the owl's feet on another piece of paper.





3) Colour them in and cut them out with the scissors.



4) Glue them onto the fir cone to make a super owl.









Tigger's here to show you how to make a super party hat. All you need is a piece of stiff card or crepe paper big enough to go around your head, some thin coloured paper strips and shiny foil or coloured paper to decorate it with and a stapler.




1) Cut a strip from the card long enough to fit around your head.



 Then cut out shapes along the top of the strip - triangles or squares look good.



3) Cut out shapes from shiny foil or coloured paper and stick them onto your hat.





Magic Tigger is here to show you how to do a super magic trick.

All you need is a postcard and a pair of round-ended scissors.

Then tell your friends that you are going to walk through a postcard.

They'll think it's impossible! Here's what you do -




1) Fold the postcard in half like this. Then cut along the fold, leaving about 1cm uncut at each end.



2) Then cut slits down to the other side, making sure you don't cut right to the edge.



3) Turn the postcard around and cut slits up the other side, between the first slits. Again, don't cut right to the edge.



4) Carefully open up the card and there's a hole big enough to step through!

Tigger's here to show you how to make some lovely frost patterns.

All you need is a piece of paper, a pencil, some paste, some salt and a brush. You may need to ask a grown-up to help you.






Tigger's here to show you how to use your great free lolly mould.

All you need is your favourite fruit juice and the mould.




1 Pour the fruit juice into the lolly mould. Fill it nearly to the top.



2 Put the top back onto the mould. This will be the lolly stick later.



3 Place the mould in the freezer. When it's frozen, take it out again.




Run the mould quickly under some water to loosen it, then pull the lolly out. **Yummy!**





Tigger's here to show you how to make a super ball and cone game.
You will need a piece of white card, a plate, a small stick, a sheet of newspaper, sticky tape, a small piece of string and some glue.

Don't forget to ask a grown-up to help you.



1 Draw half a circle round your plate on your card. Cut it out and fold it into a cone.



2 Push the stick through the cone. Tape the bottom of the cone to the stick to hold it in place.



Screw up the newspaper into a ball and wind tape all around it to hold it together. Then tape one end of the piece of string to it.

Glue the other end of the string to the top of the cone. Now hold the stick and see if you can get the ball into the cone.










Write your name on each label then stick them onto your favourite books to make sure they don't get lost.













Tigger's here to show you how to make some lovely leaf prints. All you need are some leaves, paints, brush and some plain paper.



1 With your brush and paints, paint a leaf your favourite colour.



2 Then press the painted side down onto a sheet of paper.




3 Now you have a pretty leaf print. Paint each leaf a different colour and make lots of colourful leaf prints.







Tigger is here to show you how to make a pretty paper lantern to hang on your Christmas tree. All you need is a sheet of coloured paper, some round-ended scissors, sticky tape and a grown-up to help.



1 First, fold the paper in half and cut a strip about 1cm wide off one end. This strip of paper is the handle.



2 Then cut down in strips from the fold to the other end, stopping before you reach the edge.




3 Unfold the paper and bend it around to make a cylinder. Tape the sides together.



4 Tape the handle on to your lantern and hang if from your tree. Doesn't it look pretty?



Tigger is here to show you how to make a lovely bird feeder. All you need is an empty milk carton, a felt pen, some string, some round-ended scissors, some sticky tape and a grown-up to help you.



1 Draw a square on the front and the back of the carton.



Carefully cut out the squares.



3 Sticky-tape the top of the carton together. Make a hole in the top and thread some string through it. Now, fill the carton with wild bird feed, nuts or breadcrumbs and hang it out for the birds.



Here's Tigger to show you how to make a super fuddles and muddles jigsaw. All you need is a picture from an old comic or magazine, a pen, some paste and some round-ended scissors. You will need to ask a grown-up to help.



1 First, paste the picture on to some card, and draw on some wavy lines to divide it into jigsaw shapes.




2 Then, with your scissors, carefully cut along all the wavy lines.



3 Now, muddle and fuddle up the pieces and try to put the jigsaw all back together again!





Magic Plant from the free
seeds given away with this
issue. This plant is so shy,
if you touch it, it will curl
up it's leaves just like
magic! Then, it will open
up again in half an hour.

To sow the seeds, you will need a grown-up to help you.

1) First, soak your seeds in hot water for 20 minutes. Then sow them on top of some moist compost in a shallow dish. Keep the seeds moist and warm (21-24°C/70-75°F). Your Magic Plant will grow in 3-4 weeks.

Tigger's here to show you how to make a super puzzle. You will need some card, glue, a small coffee jar lid, two silver balls (used for cake decoration) scissors, a pencil and cling film.



Glue this page onto a piece of card and carefully cut out the Tigger picture.



1) Using the point of a pencil, make two holes where Tigger's eyes should be.




3) Cover with cling film, taping it firmly at the back of the lid. Now see if you can shake the silver balls on to Tigger's eyes.



Tigger's here to show you how to make some super dancing puppets. All you need is this page from your comic, a pair of scissors, some thin card and glue.

Don't forget to ask a grown up to help you.




1) First, stick this page onto the card. Then carefully cut around the two puppets and cut out the holes.



2) Now put your fingers through the holes and make your pupper dance just like in the stories!



Tigger's here to show you how to make a super pair of binoculars to use when you're exploring. All you need is two small cardboard tubes, a long piece of string, glue, paints and brush and a grown-up to help.



1 First, paint the two tubes a bright colour with your brush.



When the tubes are dry, glue them together like this.
